First Version:

This is the 2021 Annual Business Meeting (ABM) Agenda First Version. The First Version contains Motions carried forward from 2019 that were not fully acted upon at the 2019 ABM. The First Version also contains Motions submitted relevant to Items for Discussion (IFD) discussed at the 2019 ABM and any Motions or IFDs that were accepted onto the 2020 ABM Agenda and carried forward from 2020. Finally, the First Version will add Conference Committee feedback to Motions and IFDs appearing on the 2020 Second Version, 2020 Third Version as well as any Motions or IFDs that have been accepted onto the 2021 ABM Agenda since distribution of the 2020 Fourth Version.

Motions submitted relevant to IFDs will retain the same place on the 2021 ABM Agenda as the IFD held on the 2019 ABM Agenda. If by the deadline for the Second Version of the 2020 ABM Agenda (TBD) no Motion is submitted relevant to an IFD, the IFD will be removed from the ABM Agenda. Motions can be submitted by any service body or individual, and multiple submissions are possible. As with all submissions, Motions received through this process are subject to the ARS process.

In order for Motions and IFDs to have the optimal opportunity for discussion and feedback by Conference Committees, as well as Groups and Intergroups, prior to the 2021 ABM, submit Motions or IFDs to the ARS as soon as possible. The ARS has limited time to consider Motions and IFDs that are submitted after June 04, 2021 and up to 7:00 pm Central Time, August 03, 2021. There is little or no time for the ARS to work with Submitters, where Motions or IFDs do not meet the ABM Agenda criteria, or to correct clerical errors.

The ARS members are available to assist anyone wishing to submit a Motion or an IFD for the 2021 ABM Agenda. Contact the Conference Charter Committee (CCC) or the ARS for assistance, or if you have any questions. The current ARS Process was distributed as a separate attachment to the 2021 ABM Agenda First Version. It is also available online.

We cannot emphasize enough the need for such a document. There were 365 days of entries on a topic that contained 3 elements: 1. A quote from S.L.A.A. literature 2. A share from an S.L.A.A. member on the topic and 3. A statement at the end that was mistakenly called an affirmation. These statements were in fact top line statements, prayers and affirmations. The book was edited by a professional editor. This took 1 month. The Board Outreach Committee reported in December 2018(recorded CJC call #68) that the book was back from the professional editor. It needed a moderate amount of editing and their goal was to get the book approved by the Board by January. In January, the BOC said it was taking longer than anticipated. The BOC saw the word 'affirmation' in the introduction and over 7 months changed 1/3 of every entry to reflect the idea that it should be a positive present tense affirmation. A committee of 7 members on the CLC looked at the edits in 2019 before it went to the press and asked that the Board open a conversation that this, if printed was not Conference Approved Literature. The Board stated that it wasn't 25% changed so they were moving forward. If 1/3 of each entry changed (183 statements at the end changed slightly, 166 statements at the end were big changes, 16 entries didn't change) this is more than 25% change because it changed the tone. The CLC asked the Board to delete the affirmations before printing until a group conscience could be voted on. The Board declined.		The ARS previously determined this would more appropriately be addressed by another committee(s). The request was made. One of the committees declined to participate. Thus the ARS unanimously voted to pass on to the conference. Committee Comments: None
